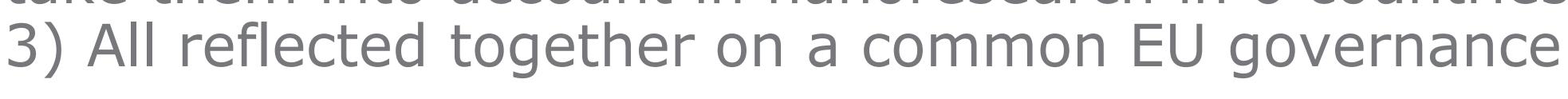
NANO2ALL Citizen-Driven Dialogue on Responsible Nanotechnology

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A staged reflection on responsible governance for nanotechnologies:

1) Citizens imagined future 'nano' objects in local dialogues and deliberated over societal perspectives around the objects 2) Stakeholders discussed how to take them into account in nanoresearch in 6 countries

Round 1: Citizen Dialogues

Participants built desirable future objects in:

- Nanomedicine
- Nanotechnology in smart textiles
- and Brain-Computer Interfaces.

The objects raised discussion about perspectives on nanotechnology research and innovation.

Round 2: National Stakeholder Dialogues

Representatives of governments, researchers, industry, civil society, media and citizens discussed ways to implement these visions. This included better identification and integration of societal perspectives in nanotechnology R&I via the increased societal engagement.
